The inaugural show exceeded our expectations – 200+ cars and \$5000 raised for the Carroll Shelby Foundation

Congratulations and thank you to members Cat and Carl LaMunyan for a successful **For the Love of Shelby Show**. The show was their vision and passion from inception, and I cannot convey the satisfaction and pride I feel about Mustang Club of Tampa's involvement in this show.

It is truly a tale of hard work by many, over time, paying off. I need to go back to the fall of 2020, to a conversation I had with club member and Treasurer Rusty Gillis. He was lamenting the end of the Silver Springs Show, NPD's annual event that kicked the new year off every January. In our attempt to re-create that magic, we recruited a few other board members and a new partner, Lead Foot City, and held our first Lead Foot City show on January 13th, 2021. Mark Morley and team judged about 90 cars, all makes and models. Far from the 600+ the Silver Springs Show attracted, but it was a start. As 2021 rolled on, and plans were being made for our November Roundup and Mason Dixon's show, we debated whether to do another show in January. In July of 2021 I got a call from Lead Foot City owner Achilles Thomas asking for some help. He had a couple of avid supporters of Lead Foot City wanting to do a multi-day car show in February 2022 to raise money for the Carroll Shelby Foundation – could we join in and help run the car show? The board felt this was a great opportunity to improve upon the January car show idea.

The avid supporters were Cat and Carl LaMunyan, and we all went to work getting ready for the show. Cat and Carl did an outstanding job of recruiting sponsors and Shelby owners, the MCT board rallied and took charge of day of registration, parking, and judging. Remembering a conversation we had with Rick Schmidt of NPD during our tour last year, we reached out and he agreed to be the title sponsor. Things seemed to be falling into place. The result – a two day show that not only raised \$5000, but it also drew 123 judged entries, adding in late arrivals and display-only cars making a day one total of just over 200 cars. Day two drew close to 100 cars of all makes and models, 43 of which competed for Best of Show via participant vote. Rick Schmidt brought in 3 cars from his collection, we had 4 race cars (all with local and national records), food trucks, two awesome bands, Carroll Shelby Racing, and the best hand-crafted trophies I've ever seen.

We are already working on ideas to make next year's show better – stay tuned, you are not going to want to miss the 2023 show.

GILLIS RESTORATIONS The Rusty Report



Bob's 1965 Mustang Coupe body had a lot of problems to fix it correctly. After thinking about how much it was going to cost to fix it, Bob decided (with a little

help from me) to turn it into a fastback. Dynacorn makes all the sheet metal needed so I started ordering parts. They make a complete inner structure already welded together. (Pictured above)





The original rear frame rails were also in pretty good shape.

The front clip was in pretty good shape along with the rear shock crossmember assembly. Brian started lining up the new floor.

The Rusty Report



A long time ago we made a jig for a 1965 Mustang that attaches to the front and rear suspension points on a Mustang. This is how Brian can restore a Mustang that has a lot of new sheet metal and keep everything in the right place and level. The rear section of the frame rail will be replaced.

Brian lined up the firewall, front and rear roof braces.





Brian marks the center of the floor and roof braces and uses a plumb bob to make sure it is lined up correctly before any welding.

The Rusty Report



Firewall welded in place still needs a lot of grinding.

Right side front fender apron, shock tower and rear fender apron welded.



Brian lined-up the firewall, upper and lower cowl, along with



the front and rear roof braces, then clamped and screwed them together. Then he can begin to weld.

Our own Rusty Gillis walked away with one of the cool hand made trophies. The students made them while learning how to weld and powder coat.






